Ambassador, Peter Harvey

Peter Harvey has been with the Nine Network since 1975 and was the News Director in Canberra before joining the NATIONAL NINE NEWS team at TCN-9’s Sydney studios in February 1997.

In 2005, Harvey celebrated 30 years with Nine and has covered several historical milestones for the network. These included the 90th anniversary of the Anzac’s Gallipoli landing with features for 60 MINUTES and SUNDAY, reporting from France on 60 years after the end of World War II and special reports on the 30th anniversary of the end of the Vietnam War.

In August 2003, together with his news commitments, Harvey joined 60 MINUTES to present the program’s Mailbag each week.

He has reported on major national political events, including the November 11, 1975 dismissal of the Whitlam Government and covered federal election campaigns, travelling with prime ministers and opposition leaders.

Harvey has reported from every continent and covered every major international trip by Australian prime ministers – from The Great Wall of China to the White House and Ten Downing Street and The Kremlin.

Harvey covered the Gulf War for the Nine Network. Based in Saudi Arabia he was the only Australian reporter with the American forces when the war began.

He also reported on the people power revolution in the Philippines that toppled Ferdinand Marcos and elected Cory Aquino.

Before joining the Nine Network, Harvey was with *The Guardian* in London and won the British Reporter of the Year Award.

Prior to that he worked with Newsweek Magazine where assignments included covering the Vietnam war in the late 1960s.

Harvey began his career as a cadet with Sydney’s *The Daily Telegraph* and in 1964 won a Walkley Award while writing for the paper.
